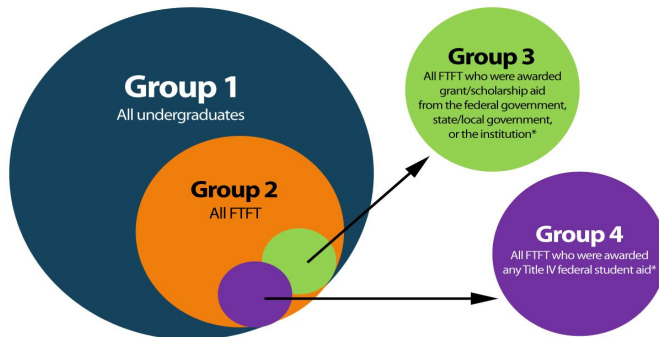
### Overview
