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
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PREFACE

UNI STUDENT PROFILE SUMMARY

SECTION I: TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT FOR FALL 2007

The total enrollment of 12,609 students at UNI for the Fall 2007 semester was an increase of 349 (2.8%) from the previous year. Undergraduate enrollment increased 308 (2.9%) while graduate enrollment increased 41 (2.6%). Of all students enrolled, 83.9% were full-time; 10.2% of the undergraduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 12 semester hours); and 56.7% of the graduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 9 semester hours). Of all students registered, 57.8% were women. Undergraduates who had declared majors in the teaching curricula were 26.5% of all declared majors.

The most popular undergraduate declared majors were: Elementary Education (1299), Biology (637), Accounting (616), Communication (553), Management (536), Finance (448), Marketing (409), Early Childhood Education (403), Psychology (396), Art (362), Physical Education and Movement and Exercise Science (349), History (315), English (291), Criminology (243), Music (237), Real Estate (221), Middle Level Education Dual Major (217), Social Work (207), and General Studies (201).

The most popular graduate majors were: Principalship (98), Educational Psychology (69), Master of Business Administration (57), Special Education (50), Speech Pathology (49), School Library Media Studies (47), Leisure, Youth and Human Services (45), Physical Education (45), Communication Studies (40), Master of Social Work (40), Mental Health Counseling (39), Psychology (35), English (33), Postsecondary Education: Student Affairs (31), and Master of Public Policy (30). Seven (7) students were enrolled in the Doctor of Industrial Technology program and sixty-eight (68) in the program leading to the Doctor of Education degree.

Of the 11,010 undergraduate students, 7,443 (67.6%) indicated an interest in Liberal Arts Curricula, 2,690 (24.4%) in the Teaching Curricula, and 877 (8.0%) were undecided or unclassified.

A total of 11,444 (90.8% of all students) were lowa residents, 1,923 (15.3%) were from Black Hawk County, and 1,287 (10.2%) were from counties contiguous to Black Hawk.

The 472 international students enrolled included 298 (17.8% increase) undergraduate students and 174 (2.8% decrease) graduate students from 71 international countries.

Of the 12,609 students, 10,903 (86.5%) were Caucasian and 357 (2.8%) were African American. Hispanics, Asians, and American Indians represented 3.1% of the enrollment. Students with no ethnic response represented 3.9% of the enrollment.

The average age of undergraduates was 21.3 years (0.1 yr. decrease) and graduates was 31.8 years (0.2 yr. decrease).

Total enrollment of veterans receiving educational benefits from the Veterans Administration was 166 students, a decrease of 32 (16.2%) from the previous fall semester.

A total of 359 (3.3%) undergraduate students and 375 (23.5%) graduate students were married, 379 (51.6%) of these married students had dependents. An additional 223 (1.8%) students identified themselves as single students with dependents.


A total of 210 students identified themselves as being disabled with 20 as mobility-impaired.

Total residence hall occupancy was 4,031 students, an increase of 125 (3.2%) from the previous year. About 33.6% of the female students (2,451) and 29.7% of the male students (1,580) reside in residence halls.

SECTION II: NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS FALL 2007

Those students new to graduate study were 427 and represented an increase of 41 (10.6%) from the fall semester 2006. A total of 164 (38.4%) received their bachelor's degree from UNI, 126 (29.5%) from other lowa colleges and 137 (32.0%) from out-of-state or international universities. Of the 427 new graduate students, 325 (76.1%) were residents of lowa.

The most popular major areas for new graduate students were: Principalship (48), Master of Business Administration (22), Psychology (22), Speech Pathology (18), Physical Education (16), Educational Psychology (15), Master of Accounting (14), English (13), Curriculum and Instruction: Elementary Education (12), Master of Public Policy (11), Postsecondary Education: Student Affairs (11), Educational Leadership (10), and Master of Social Work (10). There were 97 non-degree students.



Total Enrollment By Full-Time and Part-Time Fall 2007



Total Enrollment By Resident and Non-Resident Fall 2007







Combined Undergraduate and Graduate Minority Student Enrollment Fall 2007









UNI Residence Hall Occupancy Fall 2007







Enrolled Freshmen New From High School











Enrolled Freshmen New from High School









New Undergraduate Students for Fall 1996 through 2007*




Freshman Class of 2001** Graduation Rate of Fulltime Students Total Class and Athletes


Undergraduate Average Grade Indexes Fall Semesters


