4. Graduate Students/Declared Candidates (Page 3)

Graduate students who have been accepted for graduate study by a department of the University. It does not indicate that they received admission to candidacy.

These are added together to determine the total hours for the year. Undergraduate hours are divided by 30 (effective Fall 2004/Spring 2005) and graduate hours by 18 to determine a full-time equivalent.
